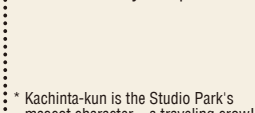

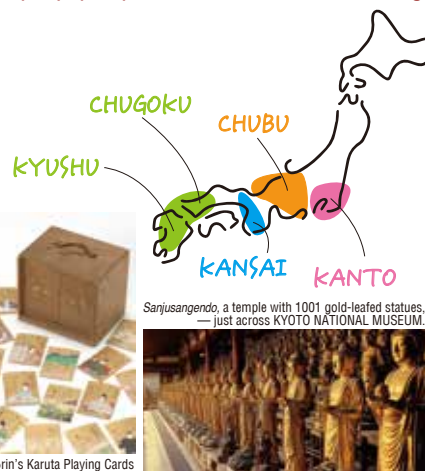

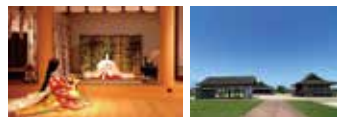

Located in Masuda, Shimane, the museum impresses with 280,000 Sekishu roof tiles and Hiroshi Naito's bold design. About 2.5 hours from Hiroshima; from Hagi-Iwami Airport, 15 min by taxi or 30 min by local bus via JR Masuda Station.

UENO

Just three stops from Asakusa, near the lively Ameyoko street market — Ueno is the cultural hub with major museums, music halls, art, and a zoo.

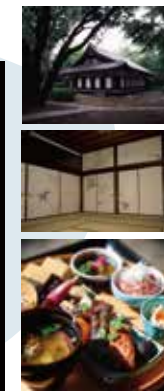
Tokyo National Museum

Important Cultural Properties Galore! /

Ueno Park facing entrance to Japan's oldest national museum displays about 3,000 works from its extensive collection. The Main building—itsself an Important Cultural Property—presents iconic samurai armor, swords, ceramics, metalwork, and lacquerware. Step outside to the garden and find TOHAKU CHAKAN, a relocated traditional shoin-style building, offering tea, meals, and special sweets.

KANAZAWA

Four Kanazawa Museums—Zen, Crafts, National Treasures & Modern Art Within Walking Distance.

Stroll along the riverside and take scenic shortcuts like the Green Path or Art Path.

On select days, a luxury bus goes to the Crafts Museum, and Daily Loop Bus departs from Kanazawa Station.

D. T. Suzuki Museum

An ideal place for visitors to deepen their insight into the thought and achievements of D. T. Suzuki (1870–1966), a prominent Buddhist philosopher. A modest work by Yoshio Taniguchi—architect of MoMA and rooted in Kanazawa—it radiates Zen-inspired harmony and invites quiet reflection.
